Emergency Management

- Riley Costello appointed new Emergency Management Director. Completed two certificate programs.
- Back-to-back spring flood response- All departments worked together on a coordinated flood response. 4th Highest River Crests in 2023 (17 feet) and 13th highest in 2024 (15 feet).
- \$273,821 in flood response grants received 2023 and 2024. Will move the skate park in 2025.
 - Also secured funding to add rip rap to the river banks.
- New lighting along Malone Park Bike Path.
- Recovered costs of labor and equipment during 2024 flood.
- Regular updates posted on Facebook and on website.











2024 Pool Highlights

- 2,200 paid visitors, 257 students using the free pass program
- Offered 212 swim lessons, 14 pool parties
- Average of 50 people participating in water aerobics, offered daily.
- New management!
- Completed new skimmer replacement and piping leaks at city pool which saved on water usage and heating costs.
- Pool revenues exceeded budget by \$3463. Continued support for WKAF Foundation for free pool pass program.



2024 Fire Department

- Wabasha Fire had 120 runs (fires, lift assists, power lines, motor vehicle crashes, water rescues). (+7 calls)
- 31 volunteers, adding three more volunteer firefighters.
- Air boat in operation for water rescues
- New fire hall expansion to improve department readiness, ventilation, HVAC.
- \$8260 grant for training.
- Fundraising: Riverboat Days Chicken Feed, raffle tickets for cash prizes, calendar donations.
- Wabasha Fire has pull tabs at four locations that resulted an \$15,000 contribution to Department.











2024 Ambulance Department



Responded to 919 calls for service. + 217 calls 31%

Billing Revenue is up 10% since last year.\$70K more than budgeted.

- 19 CPR Classes delivered- 140 people
- Delivered EMR course with 5 participants.
- First full-year of ALS. 82 pre-hospital medications, 29 ALS infusions on transfers.
- 17 Paid-On Call, 8 full/part-time staff cover 17,520 hours
- Full participation by townships in contributions.








2024 Ambulance Department

2024 Wabasha Public Library

- Library held successful summer reading, completed new mural

- Released 16 press release and continued ongoing updates on the website.








2024 Building Permits Issued
