

PROJECT SUMMARY

This project will bring people of all ages together to learn teamwork and experience outdoor recreation. It will relocate the athletic field complex that will support the larger goal to realign Highway 60 to address traffic related safety concerns and create new housing and commercial opportunities in the City.

The relocation will also move the park amenities outside of the flood area, allowing for the community to be able to enjoy amenities more often with less maintenance required. Located near City Hall and the community pool, the fields will be arranged better for spectators, accessibility, and traffic flow.

1 ICE RINK / BASKETBALL



Wabasha's amenities do not need to be a warmer month only destination. An ice rink would enhance winter programming. This area duels as a basketball court for the summer months.

2 BATTING CAGE

3 BALLFIELDS



AMENITY COST \$220,000

Ball parks are iconic locations during the summer time. A large component of the master plan includes two ballfields for the community.

4 TENNIS COURT

5 RESTROOM / CONCESSIONS / WARMING HOUSE



This building would be constructed to provide concessions and restrooms facilities and would become a warming house for the ice rink in the winter.

6 PICKLEBALL COURTS



TOTAL PROJECT COST: \$2.38 million*

TOTAL RAISED: \$1.630 million

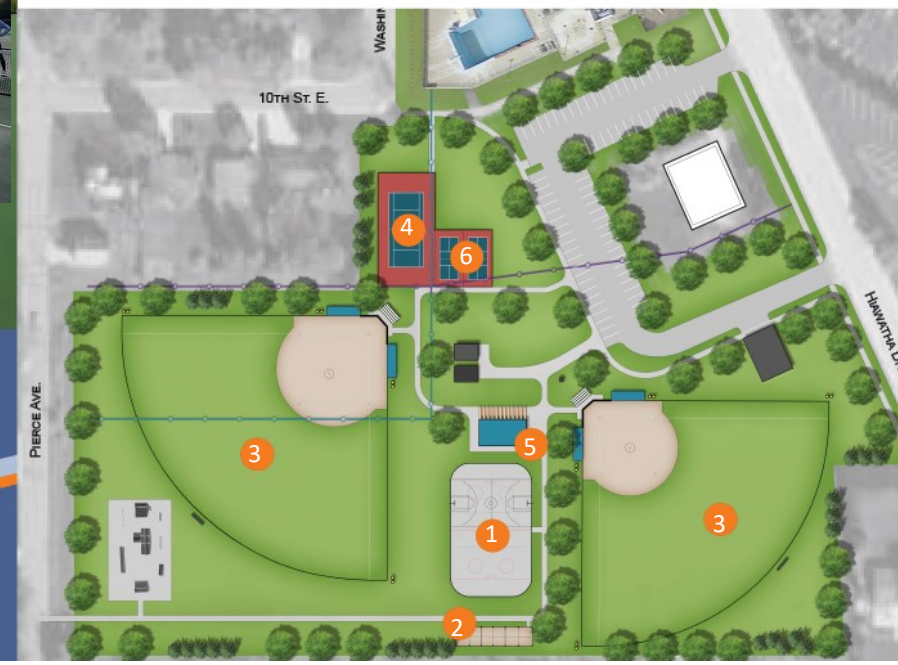
