POSITION TITLE: PUBLIC WORKS TECHNICIAN I OR PW TECH II CREW LEADER
DEPARTMENT: PUBLIC WORKS
SUPERVISOR: PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR
POSITION TYPE: PERMANENT FULL-TIME, NON-EXEMPT

OVERVIEW OF POSITION:

The Public Works Technician (I or II) serves as the main laborer (I) or lead laborer (II) carrying out the specific plans and work as directed by the Director and Assistant Director. Performs skilled maintenance work with City streets, storm sewers, equipment, grounds, buildings, city parks, swimming pool, skating rink, campgrounds, and warming house; and performs related duties as required. Will have monthly on-call requirements. Current hours are Monday-Thursday 6AM-4:30PM, four-day work weeks.¹

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

The PWT I or II is responsible for carrying out the work plan (or supervising/leading the work plan) and strategies as directed by the Public Works Director. The PWT should possess the ability to work independently and with little direction to complete the above-listed tasks.

- Perform routine and as-needed maintenance to equipment.
- Recommend short and long-term project plans and/or budget needs to the Director and Assistant Director.
- Vast knowledge of functions related to Public Works Division including, but not limited to, street and utility infrastructure, parks management, campgrounds, boat launches, pool operation and management.
- Operate a variety of highly complex equipment in repairing, installing, removing and maintaining infrastructure, easements and parks.
- Display good customer service through courteous and prompt attention to public complaints and concerns.

- Analyze and solve operational problems and/or public concerns through use of acquired knowledge and experience.
- Performs other duties as assigned or necessary.
- Maintains and repairs City streets including surfacing with asphalt; grading; patching; street cleaning; pouring and finishing concrete; applying chloride for dust coating streets; and blacktopping City parking lots.
- Operates trucks and payloaders to plow City streets, parking lots, during the winter; operates a sander and applies salt to roadways; shovels and uses snowblower as needed. Able to be on call prior to incoming storms/snowfalls.
- Cleans storm sewers; cleans catch basins and grates; and operates jackhammer as needed.
- Maintains street department buildings; Library and City Hall; performs some welding, cement work, carpentry, painting, and plumbing on City buildings, fixtures, and/or equipment as needed.
- Performs preventive maintenance on City vehicles and equipment.
- Straightens, repairs, and replaces traffic control devices and street signs that are damaged; removes hazards in roadways.
- Places cones and directs traffic, using flags as needed.
- Uses striping and roller to mark lines on streets, in parking areas, and to indicate handicapped parking areas, paints curbs.
- Cuts, trims, removes, and hauls trees.
- Cuts grass; trims and sprays weeds; plants and waters trees and flowers; trims trees; picks up brush and branches; mulches leaves; and may lay sod.
- Inspects playground areas for hazards; maintains and repairs playground equipment; paints and repairs picnic tables and benches; and drags ball fields.
- Maintains Park shelters and bathrooms including cleaning, painting, plumbing, repairing, emptying trash cans, and replenishing bathroom supplies.
- Assists with operating the ice-skating rink during the winter including flooding the rink, maintaining the ice and cleaning and maintaining the warming house; and installs snow fences.
- Assists with the operation and maintenance of the municipal boat launch and campgrounds.
- Assists in performing miscellaneous plumbing, carpentry, and electrical repairs as needed.
- Assists in winterizing parks, swimming pool, and baseball park water systems including blowing out water lines, draining water, and putting anti-freeze into toilet systems.
- Assists the water/sewer department as needed with additional manpower performing all tasks, being on call on a one week per month rotation and performing rounds during their on-call weekends.
- Assists other departments as needed.

ESSENTIAL PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Weight of objects to be lifted, carried, pushed, or pulled will range from ten (10) to fifty (50) pounds.

Movements such as stooping, twisting, bending, climbing are often required. Other movements such as kneeling, crouching and crawling are sometimes required. Audio, visual, and verbal functions (hearing, seeing, speaking) are vital aspects of this position as well as the ability to operate motor vehicles and various types of equipment.

The majority of the workday is spent outdoors with exposure to wet conditions, dust, noise, vibrations, fumes and heat as well as cold. The position requires standing, walking and sitting.

The drug and alcohol testing policies and procedures will conform to all State and Federal requirements, including Minnesota Statute 181.95 through 181.957; the Drug Free workplace Act of 1988; and/or the US Department of Transportation (DOT).

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT

Public Works employees currently hired for this position must reside within an area which will allow them to report for work within thirty (30) minutes from the time notified. Those who do not currently meet this requirement shall be allowed no more than twelve (12) months after the date that they were hired to fill the position to meet this requirement. Promotions to positions may be withheld from employees whose residence would prevent them from meeting the thirty (30) minutes response time.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC WORKS TECH I:

- Valid Minnesota Class B Driver's license with airbrakes endorsement, 1 year of maintenance or construction experience. Must possess a high school degree or equivalent.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC WORKS TECH II:

- The employee shall fulfill all duties in the Public Works Technician I job description and meeting or exceeding expectations in order to be considered for Public Works Technician II.
- The employee shall have Class B, Commercial Drivers license with air brakes endorsement.
- The employee shall possess a pool operator's certification, or must be able to obtain one within 1 year from hire.
- The employee shall be employed with the City of Wabasha as a Public Works Technician for 5 years or have been employed for another municipality or county as a public works employee, for a minimum of 5 years, with relative experience.
- Public Works Tech II shall serve in a leadership role in the absence of Public Works Director and Assistant Public Works Director.
